Jolene grew up in Saldanha Bay and attended Rustenburg Girls' High School and Vredenburg High School. While living in the UK, she qualified as a Life Coach at The London Coaching Academy.

In 2006, Jolene worked as a life coach and mentor with women and children on the West Coast of South Africa. She developed and wrote a life skills self-help coaching program as well as a program called *Grow kids*.

Jolene started an after school care project at St Andrews School, Saldanha Bay, training local women to manage the project to provide a meal, assist with homework and organise educational outings. She married a farmer, Paul Butler and ran their Guest farm.

In 2022, Jolene spearheaded the launch of a Langebaan Charter of Rotary and, following in the footsteps of her father and grandfather, she was appointed as their president.

Recently, Jolene attended the Boarding House School Reunion as a stayover at Erinville Hostel which brought back memories and she shared:

"In 1966 and 1967, for standard 7 and 8, I attended a Rustenburg girls' school, where I felt confined after having left my carefree life on the farm in Saldanha bay at 13 years old. As a boarding student, I was only allowed out for 2 weekends per term.

At the Boarding House Reunion Stayover, I spent the night in the dorms, just as I had 60 years ago. This fun reunion brought back a mix of good and sad memories, but I was grateful for the lifelong friendships formed during my time there.

Many of my fellow students came from farms and remote areas across South Africa, Namibia, and Zambia, and we all traveled by train to attend school...here are pictures from 50 years ago..."

## E96 Nicky Greenwall

*Honouring one of SA's Most talented TV Producers, Directors and Writers*



Nicola Greenwall is a former TV-presenter, entertainment journalist and producer. Her print journalism has been featured in *Marie Claire*, *Elle*, *Seventeen*, *Glamour*, and the *Sunday Times* publications. Her recent debut novel, “*A Short Life*”, published in 2024, was listed for the *Sunday Times Literary Award* and short-listed for the *Neilsen SA Book Awards*. This superbly written murder mystery is South African fiction at its best.

While still attending the High School, Nicky had her first job as a co-presenter in a local educational series. Here she discovered her love for the camera.

Nicky chose to follow a career in advertising at the *Red and Yellow School* and graduated in 1998, having studied art. She became the art director at *TBWA Advertising Agency* in Cape Town and in Johannesburg and thereafter at *The Jupiter Drawing Room*.

As a TV producer, Nicky became the arts anchor for *E News*. Her talent allowed her to host *Nightlife*, a program that interviewed *Mzansi* celebrities.

Nicky met her partner, Robbin Fryer in 2003 and they have 2 children, Georgina and Riley. In 2004 Nicky relocated to Cape Town. Her suggestion for an entertainment news program launched the popular *Showbiz Report*.

In 2016, Nicky wrote a book, “*I’m Famous in South Africa*” and two years later she produced a documentary titled “*The Beautiful People*”. She is best known for directing multiple award-winning shows, among them “*Beautiful People*”, “*The Close-up*”, “*The Showbiz Report*” and “*Behind The Name*”.

At the moment, Nicky manages *Greenwall Productions*, a company she founded in 2009 and has produced several programs related to the *Mzansi* market. She is currently also the international marketing manager of *Twenty Modelling Agency*.

Nicky has been nominated twice for her exemplary work in the film industry: In 2018 for Best Documentary by *International Fashion Film Awards* and for Best Fashion Documentary.

Nicky's outstanding contributions gained her acknowledgement as one of Mail and Guardians Top 200 young South Africans. She is an amazing ambassador for Rustenburg Girls' High School.



## E00 Monique Hellenberg

### *A Tribute to Monique and her twin sister, Lisa*



Monique Hellenberg is an award-winning, versatile vocalist in the genres of Jazz, Pop, R&B and World Musical Theatre. She is well-known for her hit song recording of “This Is How It Goes” with “Goldfish”.

Despite having lost her twin sister, Lisa, during her matric year, Monique managed to matriculate with three A’s and went on to carve out an incredible music career for herself. She graduated with Bachelor of Music (Jazz Studies), Performance from UCT in 2004. and went on to achieve a Higher Certificate, Audio Technology 2021 from the Academy of Sound Engineering.

She started as a Vocal coach at Micklefield Primary School and then at RGHS in 2007. She travelled to take up Resident Singer posts at hotels in Bahrain, Beijing, Shanghai and Bankok. Back in SA, she lectured in Jazz voice at UCT in 2021.



In 2022 she became a Lecturer in Jazz & Contemporary Voice at Nelson Mandela University in Gqeberha and has spearheaded the development of this post. Monique is in the process of completing her Masters studies in jazz voice.

Recently, Monique wrote & recorded 3 new original songs. Two of them, “*Saw It Wrote It Got It*” and “*Spend A Little Time*”, made it to the Heart 104.9FM CTM Top 40. She has performed in “*Afternoon with the Classics*” concert at Grey High School and in shows in Johannesburg and has been appointed as the lead singer for the Algoa Bigband.

This year Monique was invited to adjudicate on the auditioning panel for the National Youth Jazz Band. Due to her passion for education & excellent administrative skills, she was also elected as the secretary for the South African Jazz Education Network.

Monique unveiled her most personal project yet with the release of her new single, “*No Regrets*,” a moving tribute to her late twin sister, Lisa Hellenberg. This emotional track was originally composed by Lisa as a farewell gift to a friend who was moving to the UK. It was first written when the sisters were young girls and has been revived after 24 years.

The Lisa Hellenberg Bursary is awarded by RGHS annually to a learner studying Music at RGHS for her Matric Year. It was initiated by the Hellenberg Family and Ms Sole (Head of Music) as a tribute to Lisa Hellenberg.

## E18 Justine Crook-Mansour

### *Reaching for the Stars*



Justine is currently a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford University. She has a strong interest in space and wants to work at the intersection of computer science and astrophysics.

Justine achieved first place in the Western Cape and Nationally in the National Senior Certificate exams. Her school sports included first team tennis, hockey and cross country and other activities included being a prefect, secretary of Interact and editor of the Bug magazine.

Justine continued to excel at university, majoring in physics and computer science at an undergraduate level at the University of Cape Town. She also took courses in mathematics and applied mathematics and continued to play hockey.

Her dedication to learning earned her awards: Golden Key International Honour Society, Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship and the Dean's Merit list for 3 years, class medals for MAM1043H & PHY3004W, Steve Driver Prize, and the Ivor Lewin Memorial Scholarship.

In 2022, she took a year off from studies to work at the South African Astronomical Observatory on various science engagement and coding projects. During that year, she initiated a physics tutoring programme for final-year students at an under-resourced school in her area – a project she continues to manage. Justine completed her Honours degree in Astrophysics at UCT in 2023.

Last year, she was one of 25 students selected to attend the 18th Vatican Observatory Summer School in Italy. The topic of the school was aimed to equip participants with the essential tools and techniques for navigating the challenges of astronomical surveys generating large amounts of data.

Alongside her studies, Justine is an Allan Gray Orbis Foundation Candidate Fellow. The highly-respected organisation's programme focuses on training high-impact, responsible entrepreneurs. She is enthusiastic about venturing into the world of software innovation and is actively working on upskilling herself in this domain.

Having a strong desire to drive positive change through entrepreneurial initiatives, Justine initiated a tutoring programme, "The Rising Star Project".

She was awarded a Rhodes Scholarship in 2024. It is with pride that we applaud Justine's passion and dedication to learning that has led her this far and we support her on her further journey.



## E12 Neda Isaacs

*Passionate about Injury Prevention and Sports Performance*



Combining her passion for sport and medicine, Neda chose a career in physiotherapy. She graduated from the University of Cape Town with a B.Sc in Physiotherapy with a distinction in Clinical Physiotherapy.

During her community service year Neda had the opportunity to work for team Western Cape in the Annual Rural Games held in Limpopo. During this time she was able to work with elite junior athletes originating from low income backgrounds. It was from this experience that she found an untapped area of research – coaches' knowledge of injury and associated risk factors among young track and field athletes. She was accepted by UCT to study a MSc in Exercise Physiology & Sports Physiotherapy.



While completing her masters she began working as a locum for *Naylor and Croy Physiotherapy*. Here she worked alongside well accomplished female sports physiotherapists.

She began working at Megan Chetty Physiotherapy, treating neuromuscular and sports-based injuries across all ages. She is a Senior Physiotherapist at Chetty and Isaacs Physiotherapists and is passionate about injury prevention and performance for the vulnerable athlete through to the elite athlete.

Neda is also involved in various sporting codes. She currently holds the position as head of medical for Western Cape Athletics and Netball as well as being the head physiotherapist for the Western Cape Tornados Netball and False Bay Rugby Club.

Not only does Neda assist athletes, but she is an athlete in her own right. She has represented South Africa at the Touch Rugby World Cup on 2 occasions and has captained her team at the 2019 World Cup in Malaysia.
